Choose activities to suit your child. Grown-up help for cutting.

A little guide for grown-ups

Print a favourite page or the whole book. Explore at your child's pace, and enjoy the conversation as much as the finished picture.

Ready to print

Use A4 paper, portrait orientation and single-sided printing. Choose "Fit to printable area" if your printer clips edges. Most pages work well in black and white; two tracing sheets include small colour illustrations. No borderless printing is needed.

Gather a few simple supplies

Pencils, crayons or washable markers are enough for most pages. For pages 11-12, add child-safe scissors and a grown-up to help. Keep loose cut pieces away from younger children.

Make it your own

Begin with a colouring sheet or one tracing line. Try a finger before a pencil. Offer a choice of colours, name the animals together and take a break whenever your child wants one.

Cutting activities

Supervise all cutting. A grown-up can cut the animal puzzle cards along the printed grid, or prepare the spiral snake. Cut along the spiral only, not across the decorative body markings.

Jungle friends

Colour the animals. Which friend would you like to meet?



Talk together: name each animal and describe one thing you notice.

Monkey in the trees

Give this playful monkey a colourful jungle home.



Talk together: find the tail, the leaves and the flowers.

Parrot on a branch

Choose colours for the feathers, beak and leafy background.



Talk together: invent a friendly greeting for your parrot.

Snake by the river

Decorate the snake with your own colours and patterns.



Talk together: trace the winding body with your finger before colouring.

Follow the jungle trails

Follow each dotted trail with a finger, then try a pencil.

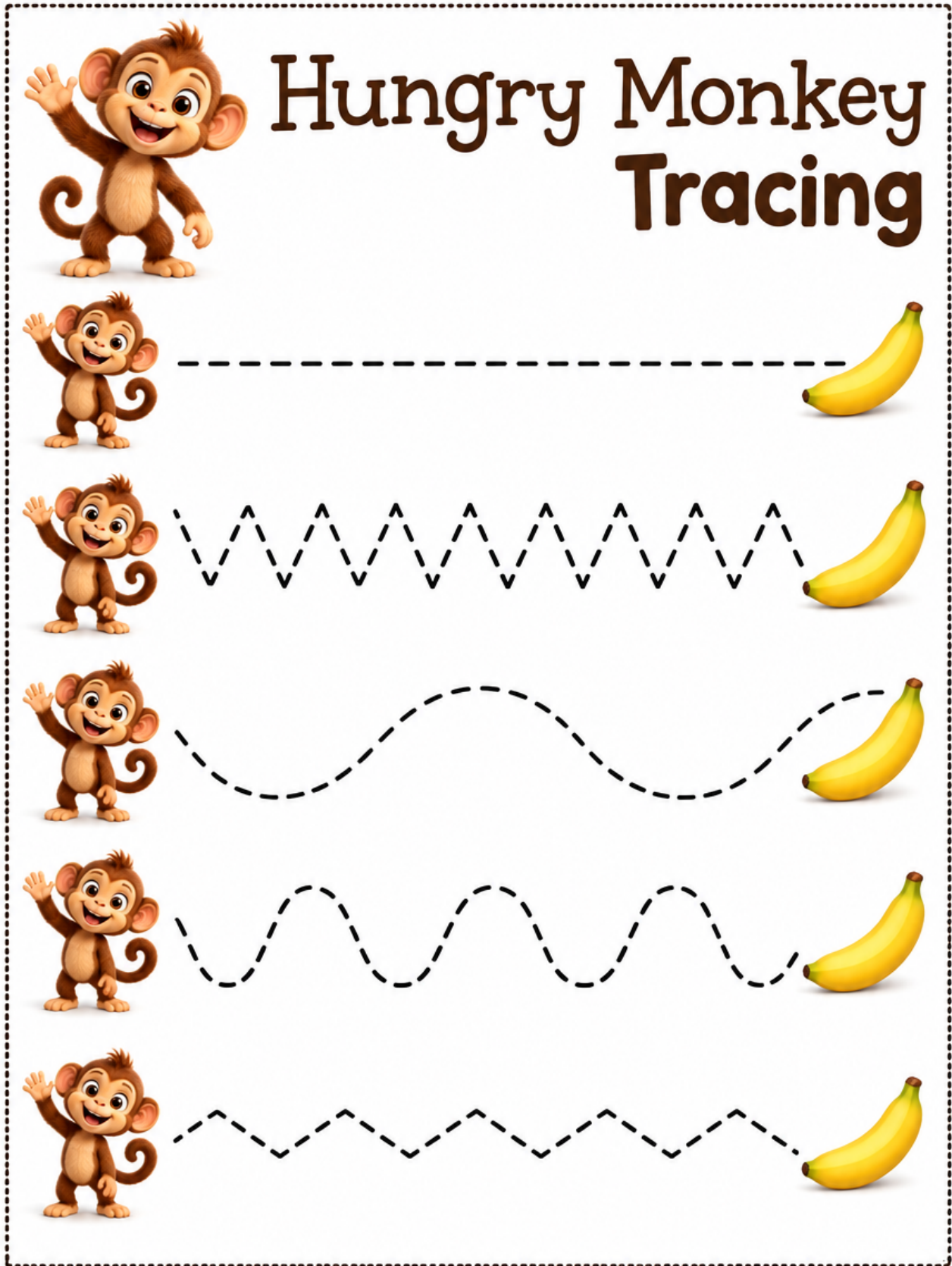
Tracing Lines



Grown-up tip: choose one line at a time. A little wobble is part of learning.

Hungry monkey trails

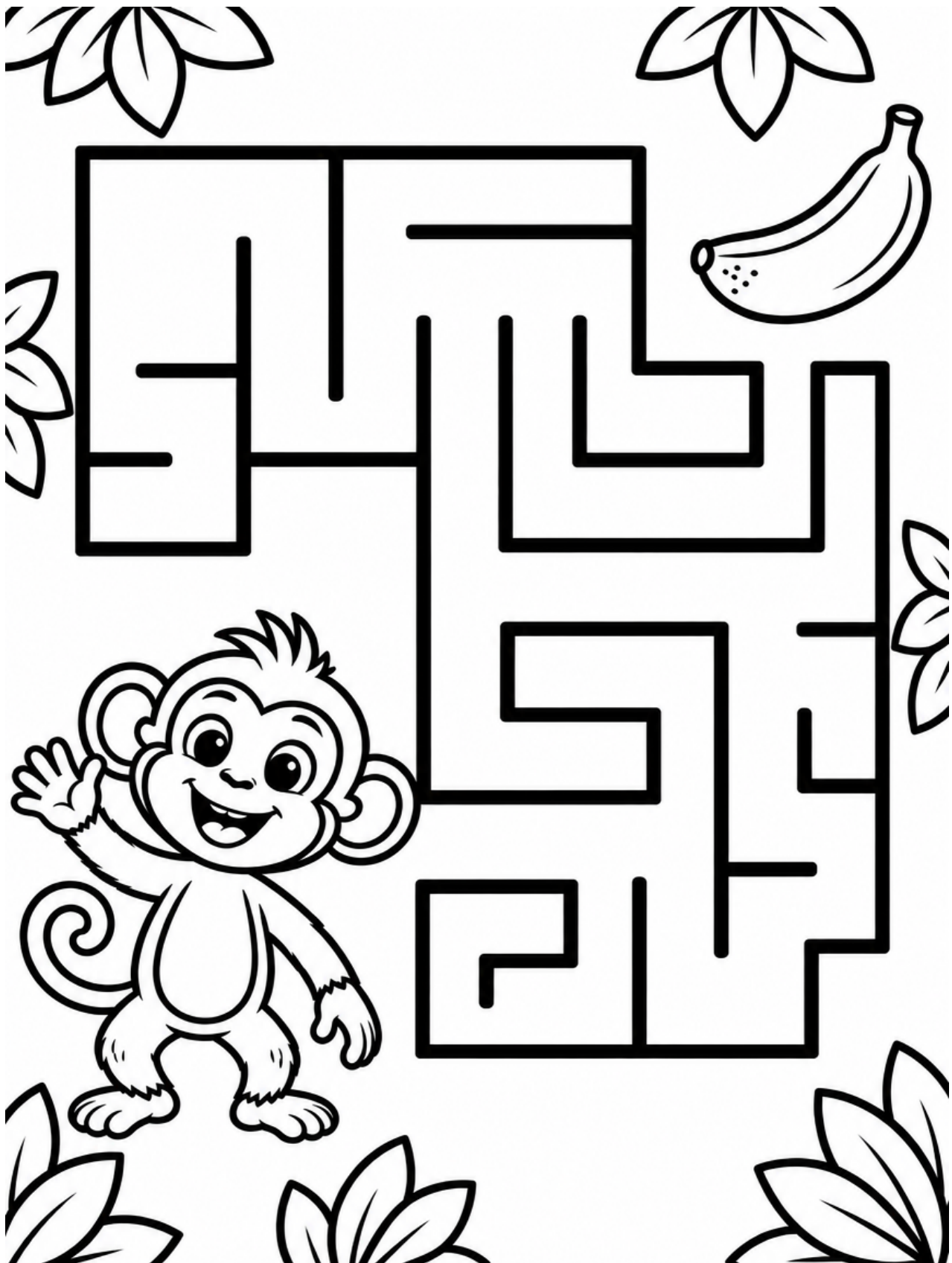
Help each monkey follow its trail towards a banana.



Grown-up tip: let your child set the pace; there is no need to finish every line.

Explore the maze

Look for a path from the monkey towards the banana.



Try a finger first. If a wall blocks your way, go back and try another route.

Count with the parrot

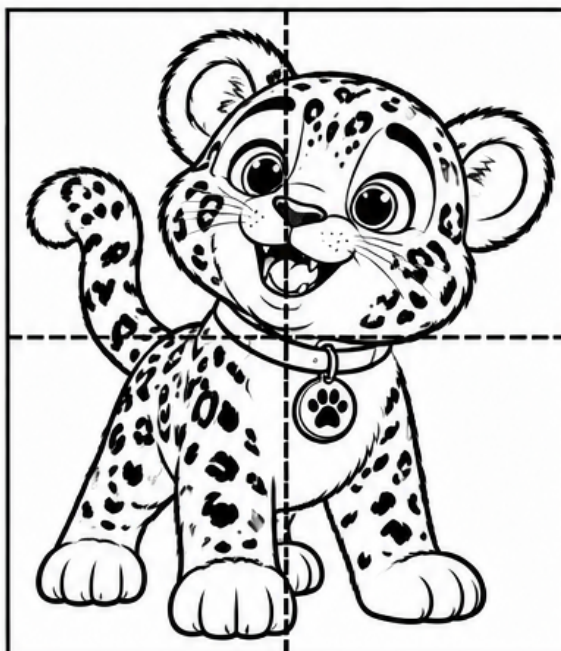
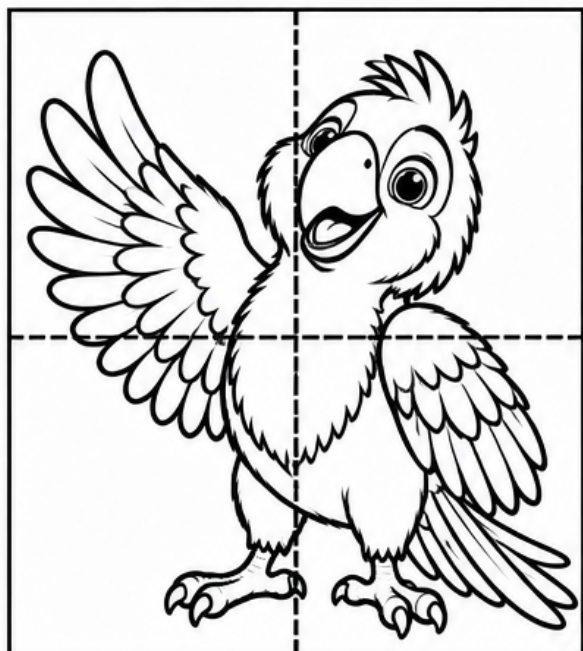
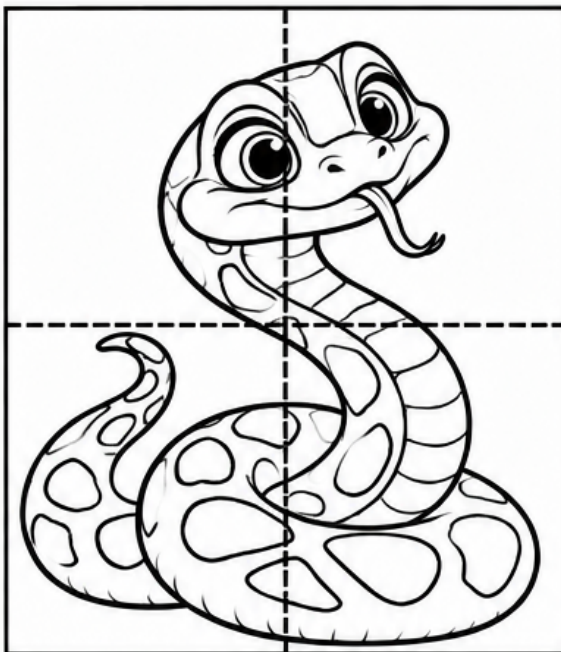
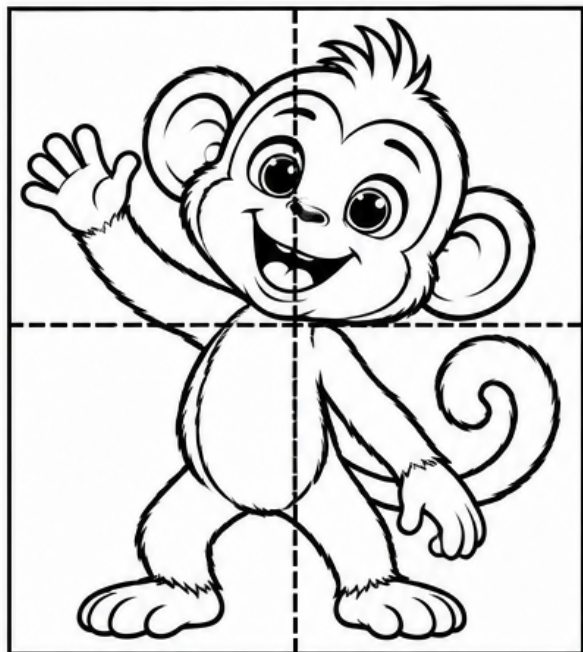
Find the numbers 1 to 10 in order, then colour the parrot.



Point to each numbered dot as you count together.

Animal picture puzzles

Colour the four pictures, then ask a grown-up to cut along the grid lines.



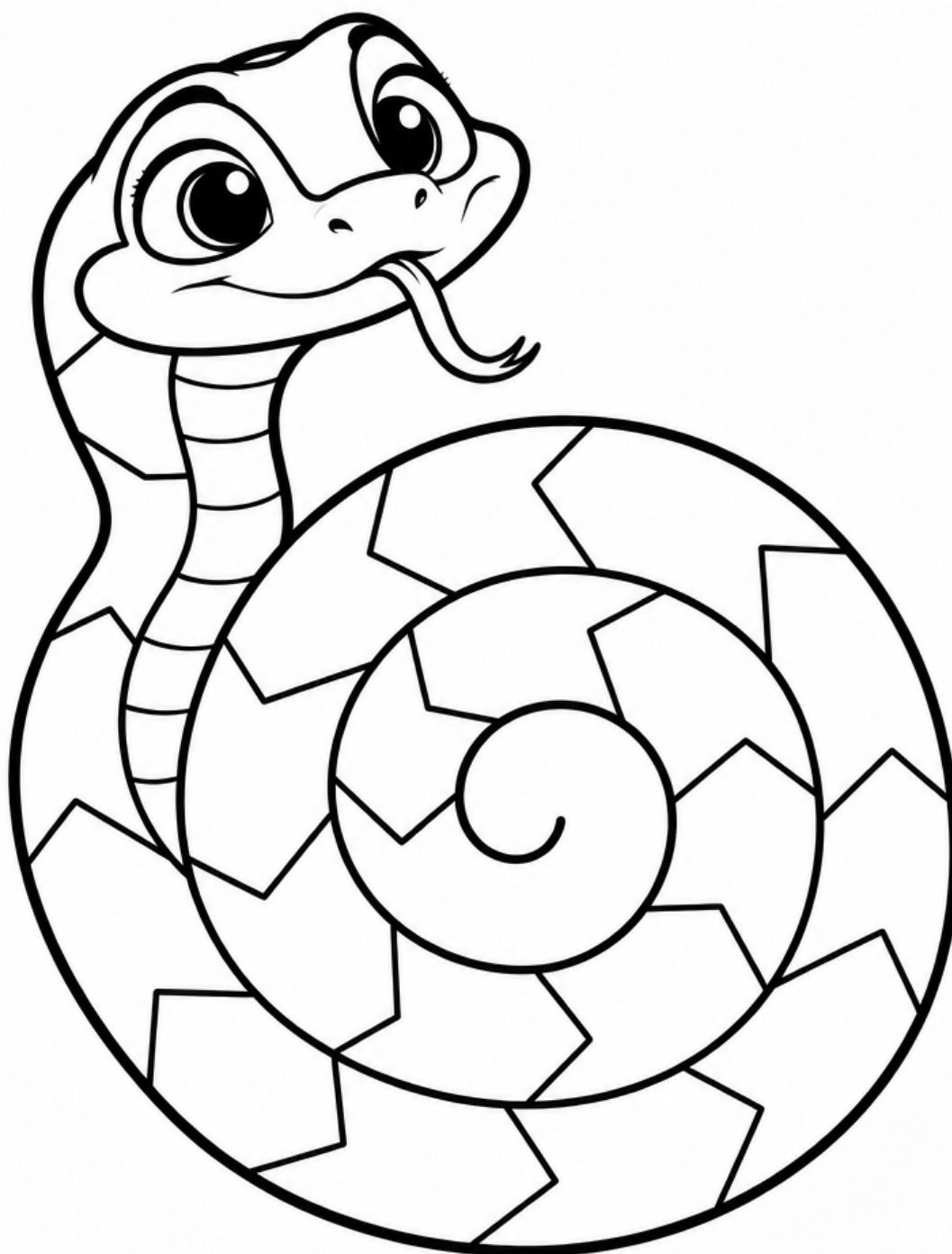
Keep each animal separate at first. Mix its pieces and rebuild the picture.

Make a spiral snake

Colour the snake, then ask a grown-up to help cut it out.

Cut the outer edge, then follow the spiral from the outside towards the head.
